BC Association of Clinical Counsellors presenting at the Canadian Network of Agencies of Regulation (CNAR) Conference – CNAR 2022

Preparing for the transition to a single-mandate association and pure-play regulator is a big undertaking with far-reaching implications that affect association culture, finances, governance, bylaws, and organizational structure. Board, executives, staff and members must all be prepared for the full scope of such a transition.

The presenters will bring their experiences and lessons learned through this process to attendees.

BCACC has enjoyed collaborating with the PEI Counselling Association on this topic as we move further into regulatory modernization and prepare for the transition to counselling regulation by the government.
